- All requests for Clinical Laboratory tests are made electronically into the CPRS computer system by authorized healthcare providers The Laboratory personnel are not authorized to place orders for Laboratory testing except under situations such as: - Lab test orders that are cancelled and are required to be recollected

CLINICAL LABORATORY SERVICES COVERAGE Medicare may cover diagnostic clinical lab tests that meet the 1988 Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) CLIA requires human laboratory specimen testing quality standards The Secretary of the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) must certify the laboratories that perform

#### **Clinical Chemistry - Abbott Core Laboratory**

Clinical chemistry is the branch of laboratory medicine that focuses primarily on molecules The tests in a clinical chemistry laboratory measure concentrations of biologically important ions (salts and minerals), small organic molecules and large macromolecules (primarily proteins) See Section

#### **How to obtain a CLIA Certificate of Waiver**

NOTE: Congress passed the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) in 1988 establishing authority to promulgate standards for certain laboratory testing to ensure the accuracy, reliability and timeliness of test results regardless of where or by whom the test was performed

CLINICAL LABORATORY SERVICES paymentbasics PAYMENT SYSTEM Medicare is the largest single purchaser of clinical laboratory services Clinical lab services are tests on specimens from the body (such as blood or urine) that are used to diagnose and treat patients Under Part B, Medicare covers medically reasonable and necessary laboratory services
